#### Hollyblue 5K Your Way

On Sunday 1st October, Coole Park played host to Gort Cancer Support's inaugural '5K Your Way' fun run. The event was organised not only to raise much needed funds for Gort Cancer Support, but also to offer a fun family-friendly event for the local community in the beautiful surrounds of our very own Coole Park.

The weather Gods were on our side as the sun shone down on around 130 participants who registered to take part. The serious runners were easily spotted with their Garmin's ready to go, while the less serious chatted and laughed together in the beautiful October sunshine.

At 10.30am runners, walkers, toddlers and even some four-legged-friends took on the wellestablished parkrun route, consisting of two 2.5km loops, starting off from Coole House and finishing at the tearoom gates.



With an impressive time of 19.05, Noel Diviney was the first man home.

The female winner, young Caitlin Mulkerrins, crossed the finish line in 24.23, proving that determination knows no age.

Mary Nolan presented the winners with their trophies and all participants received a medal in recognition of their efforts.

Among the participants was Ken, all the way from Western Australia, representing the global reach of the event. Ken had been visiting family in the area and decided to take part in the event as he also works with a cancer charity back home. The diversity of participants on the day underscored the universal appeal of supporting those affected by cancer and the significance of a united effort to make a positive impact.

The event was a huge success, and it has been decided that "5K Your Way" will become an annual fixture, providing a consistent platform for the community to come together, run for a cause, and to support Gort Cancer Support.

#### **Extract from We Act - Good News Gazette**

Iryna is from Berdyans'k in Ukraine. She and her daughter came to Gort, County Galway in April 2022 to flee the war in their home country. She now works at Gort Cancer Support, a communitybased support service for South Galway and North Clare. This is her #WeAct story...

After coming to the Gort Cancer Support Centre a few times, I told them I wanted to be useful, that I was looking for a job. I started working here on a Tús Scheme on 4th of September as an Administrative Officer.

When you don't have work, you have a lot of time to think about family back home, or to read the news. But when you work, it distracts you a little bit.

"I'm happy that I can be useful here in Ireland. People here are amazing, and it's really important to me, when we've received so much help and support, that we give something back.

When my daughter and I arrived in Gort, we had just two backpacks and the clothes we were wearing. That's it. And the local people welcomed us so warmly. Cosy rooms, food, clothing. The first thing we heard was, "This is your home."

I have a PhD in Philological Science. I was a teacher of Ukrainian language and literature, and I was also an English teacher. So I started helping other Ukrainians, I went to schools, and other organisations, and translated for them. Then I was asked to come to Gort Cancer Support to help a lady from Mariupol who had no English. I said of course, it was the least I could do to help.

I might work on the computer, I meet and greet, I help prepare the studios for activities. It's a lovely place. People get a huge amount of support when they come here.

This place is like an oasis in the desert for cancer patients and their families, we have everything they need to feel better in themselves, counselling, reflexology, art therapy, gardening workshops, it's really amazing.

I want to show the Irish people how grateful I am for all the help we got.

When you arrive into a foreign country, you don't know what to expect, but I was just captured by the warmth of people in Gort. I'm so happy to be here.

We don't know how long we will be here, we can't plan for the future, so we have to live in the here and now. And I know the best thing I can do while I'm here is to try to help and to give back."
