We also provided over 75 manual lymph drainage treatments, helping to reduce pain and swelling as well as improving comfort for those experiencing lymphedema as well as 120 drives to oncology appointments and treatments, ensuring that patients have reliable transportation to receive the care they need, to mention just a few.

Over 900 supportive activities were participated in, such as peer support, yoga, tai chi, art with Mavis, arts and crafts, meditation and singing group. Your contributions have made a significant difference in the lives of many and we are deeply grateful for your continued support.
